We will be starting the dirt work as soon as possible. Then, we will continue with roughing in the utilities and pouring the

concrete. Currently, we have all the funds in place to complete this first stage of the project.

The next phase will consist of purchasing the steel building, metal roofing, and erecting the building on the slab. The approximate cost for this stagewill be \$135,600. I hope and pray that you will continue to support the funding of this wonderful addition to Rock Haven Bible Camp.

On the floor in the maintenance building someone wrote in the concrete the date Oct 23, 1983. This was the first building to be placed on this property. Starting from that date, the rest of the construction of the "new" Rock Haven Bible Camp began. In the summer of 1984, the first camp session began. This summer we celebrate 40 years of ministry on this site.

Many people I meet tell me of their attending camp when it was on the river. I remember being on that property one time when I was only five and I vaguely remember that event. In the winter of 1984, my dear friend Tim Bartlow asked me to come and help him do some work at the camp. The job was to put in a hanging ceiling in one of the bedrooms. I tell people that I have only installed two hanging ceilings in my life. That one. My First and my Last. Yet, I kept coming back. I remember that the original chapel was downstairs where the game room is now located. There was no hanging ceiling to hide the pipes, wiring or rafters. The pews were from the original camp. They were simple wooden pews with

a few places for song books and Bibles. The one thing that I do remember is the changed lives. I don't know how many accepted Christ in 1984, because I didn't start volunteering until that winter. I thank God for allowing me since then to see many come to know Christ.

In celebration of this we are planning now for our 40^{th} year of ministry at this location. Every year before our camp program starts, we hold a camp reunion. This year we want to make this a very special occasion. In the past, we have held reunions on the Sunday before camp starts. This year we are planning on moving the reunion to Saturday July 6 from 12:00 PM to 4:00 PM. We are planning to have more activities at this reunion. The bounce house will be up and running, games for the kids, and times for testimonies. We would love to hear how Rock Haven Bible Camp has affected your life.
